Minutes

1. Call to Order (13:30)

a. Bucky called the meeting to order at 1:35 pm.

4. Approve Minutes – April 2023

5. Update - Flood Response for Tooele County

- a. We are just starting to see noticeable increases at the reservoirs. Settlement Canyon Reservoir may start spilling tonight or tomorrow morning. Middle Canyon is flowing right now as well. The groups that will be affected by this are aware and prepared. The State Hydrologist believes June 1-8th will be Tooele County's peak runoff time. Would like to give praise to the departments working since Jan of this year to prepare for a spring runoff. Bucky shared Glen Merrill's hydrology report from May 8th.
- b. June 1st starts the beginning of Wildfire season.

6. Update - Hazardous Materials Permitting for Tooele County and the municipalities.

a. Jan 2023 the LEPC took action to support Tooele County in a hazardous materials permitting process. The work on the permitting process will be available in its draft form for evaluation by the LEPC and the county council mid-year. It will be a very comprehensive process that will allow data to be analyzed and determine how to handle hazardous materials in Tooele County.

7. Local Reportable Incidents -

- a. Main Street and 400 South 100 Gallon Diesel Spill
 - i. There was a vehicle crash that occurred and caused a hazardous materials spill. Clean up occurred and they are monitoring the location to make sure the asphalt is in good condition.
 - ii. Dominion is doing a line upgrade and has experienced intermittent interruptions.

8. State Reports:

- a. UDEM Carly Sands
 - i. The State is starting to look at a Presidential Declaration. Tooele County has not declared a State of Emergency currently. Tooele Army Depot has a large amount of space that can hold large amounts of water.
- b. State Fire Marshal Liaison Wade Francis
 - i. They have been busy with hazmat ops training. They may be doing a hazmat tech class in Sept. They are looking to bring more training- dates TBD.

10. Reports/Action - Old Business

- a. Rocky Mountain Power held a tabletop exercise for the LEPC and Tooele County last month. It brought to light that the access and functional needs population have some concerns in a power outage.
- b. Tracy Frailey- TCHD has a new program called emPOWER. It provides data of people who require power for life safety. It is an amazing tool that will aid first responders. The data is not storable and has to be destroyed every 30 days to protect patient privacy.

- a. Brandon Foil- Clean Harbors- they received renewal of their star status for VPP.
- b. Dave Blackburn- they are working on water management at their site. Their new facility for rail car dumping is done and they are hoping for operations by Aug.
