 - a. Tooele County has built a new capability in partnership with the Tooele County Health Dept to respond to Mass Casualty Incidents. It will be used at Country Fan Fest and deployable to mass gatherings in the county
- 7. Local Reportable Incidents by Jurisdiction
 - a. North Tooele Fire District
 - i. TDC Response
 - 1. TDC is a known hazardous materials site. The response was centered around that possibility. Many different agencies were involved. The scene was cleared of hazardous materials. Joe Hatch was so proactive and had the facility well set up for a hazmat response. We're sorry for the unfortunate ending.
 - **a.** We will continue to work on getting the address to the facility resolved with Google.
 - b. Tooele City
 - i. Mountain West Medical Center
 - 1. MWMC had an individual exposed to a chemical and came to the facility for decontamination. Tooele City Fire Department was requested to assist with the

decontamination. Ultimately, they determined to transport the person to a Salt Lake Hospital.

ii. Leitner Poma Response

1. We hope to have Leitner Poma join the LEPC. They had a small event at their facility recently. The response went well.

iii. Other

- 1. We had a grass fire due to an individual welding in Stockton.
- 2. Rocky Mtn Power will be doing power outages during a fire threat. We be working with elected officials to help with the understanding of the power outages.

c. Grantsville City

i. Rocky Mtn Power had to de-energize the lines in Grantsville due to fire threat.

d. South and West Tooele County.

i. MP 14 on SR73 Asphalt Oil/Emulsion Tanker Rollover

1. An Asphalt Oil Truck had a rollover on SR73 and scattered 2 trailers filled with asphalt emulsion. The road was closed for a time and clean up resources were dispatched. The chemical itself was not classified as a hazardous material the risk was extreme heat.

a. At this point in time there are no fire restrictions set by the State of Utah. However, individual towns and cities can set their own restrictions.

- c. June 20 Hazardous Materials Response tabletop exercise.
 - i. TCEM held a hazmat tabletop exercise on behalf of the LEPC. The scenario was a tanker truck roll over, a lithium-ion car fire, 25 injuries all near a school. Many agencies participated and we had a great discussion.
