- b. Regina Nelson-Dispatch- Regina mentioned they are currently working with Spillman to improve its ability to identify and page the closest available medical unit to be paged to the medical scenes
- c. Jeff Wyatt- TCSD- The Tooele County School District is still managing COVID throughout the local school system. They are currently waiting for the legislature to determine if they will change state law on test to stay and the use of masks in the schools. The staff of the district are tired just like the medical providers and will look forward to COVID being behind them.
- d. Glenn Reinicke- MWMC- They have some critical shortages on blood. They have been approved for a cardiac CT scanner. It will be one of the best in the state. They will start a robust cardiology program in the later part of the year.
- e. Mike Atherley- Savage- They have had a couple changes in ops managers. There will be a new manager in a couple weeks. They will start transloading diesel fuel in the next 2 weeks.
- f. Scott VonHatten- New Tooele City Emergency Response Coordinator.
- g. Eric Grange/ Dustin Brewer- Clean Harbors- They would like to hold a large-scale exercise and have participation from partners in the county. It would be at the Clive facility. They intend to propose it to the fire chief's association as well as the LEPC. Possibly fall time frame. They have bolstered operations bringing online a shredder at the Aaragonite Facility. They have a few other operations at their smaller facilities. They are boosting their Emergency Response capabilities. This time next year there could be over 100 employees at Clive location.
- h. Bucky Whitehouse- TCEM- There was a follow up meeting today for Dyno Nobel. They would like to be off SR73 at Stark Road. That location could put additional demands on the area. That will create another risk in the South Area.
